This Friday is truly one of my favorite patriotic days -- Veterans Day. Originally known as Armistice Day, its purpose was to commemorate the end of fighting between the Allied nations and Germany, which took effect at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of the year in 1918. The date was declared a national holiday in remembrance of soldiers lost during World War I. Each November 11, at exactly 11:00 a.m., a wreath is laid at the Tomb of the Unknowns in Arlington National Cemetery in a touchingly solemn ceremony honoring and thanking all those who have served in the United States Armed Forces.



THIS WEEK WE FEATURE: DR. PAULINE WILLIAMS, SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST, WHS BROOKSIDE CAMPUS

Dr. Pauline Williams joined District 60 in 2002 as the school psychologist at Juarez and Benny middle schools. In 2004 she was named the school psychologist at Jefferson Middle School, and one year later she began in her current position, as the school psychologist at Waukegan High School. Prior to joining the District full time, Dr. Williams spent the 1997-98 school year as an intern at Clearview and Jefferson. Dr. Williams has a Bachelor's degree in business administration from National Louis University. She has also earned a Master's degree in education as well as in school psychology, and Ed.D. in Disability Studies from National Louis. Dr. Williams also studied at the teacher's college in Kingston, Jamaica. She was a teacher and an auditor in Jamaica prior to moving to the United States in 1979.



Dr. Williams was nominated for this week's Spotlight in recognition of her work with the Principals Scholars Program (PSP). The PSP is a partnership between the University of Illinois-Chicago (UIC) and WHS. Students in 10th through 12th grades are invited to the Chicago campus for five consecutive Saturdays during fall and again in spring, where they have the opportunity to take a dozen unique classes, including anatomy and kinesiology, creative writing and ACT preparation. Dr. Williams is one of two volunteers in the program, the other being former Spotlight winner Mr. Julius Cullen. Though she is not required to assist with the PSP program, Dr. Williams has gone out of her way to help the students involved. She works with teachers and others in identifying students who would greatly benefit from the classes offered at UIC. Dr. Williams also takes on extra responsibility by serving as the secretary for the high school's Faith Based Council. When she's not taking on extra responsibilities, Dr. Williams is known as a very talented employee who charms and comforts co-workers with her positive energy.

"Dr. Williams is someone who generally wants to make a difference, and she's been persistent about reaching out to teachers, and reaching out to students. She just gets great joy out of what she does, and it's clear that she cares." ~ Mr. Gutman

District Spotlight

DISTRICT 60'S STEPS PROGRAM IS EXPANDING

After more than 10 years of helping parents become English proficient, Waukegan Community Unit School District # 60's Success for Teaching English to Parents and Students (STEPS) program is seeing its first major expansion this year.

The STEPS program, which works with parents who want help with their English proficiency, has become so popular that the District has added a spring session to the traditionally fall class. The eight-week class invites parents with students in pre-kindergarten to eighth grade to attend English classes, where District 60 instructors teach basic language principles that will allow them to better assist their student with his or her school work.

Classes are broken up into beginner, intermediate and advanced groups, and are held twice per week for two hours at Glen Flora Elementary School. While parents meet in the classrooms, District staff work with their students on reading intervention programs and homework help in the school's cafeteria.

"The ultimate goal is to help the parents help their students at home. Parents are an important extension of classroom learning after the regular school day, it is parents who then facilitate the reinforcement of the daily curriculum; assisting with homework," said Mr. Jon Widger, an Assistant Principal at Waukegan High School, who also works as Coordinator of the STEPS programs.

Mr. Widger has seen program interest grow rapidly in the past two years. Last year more than 100 parents took advantage of the free, grant-funded classes. This year, more than 150 parents have already enrolled for the initial fall session, which runs from October to December. It has proven to be so successful, that another session will be held in the spring from February to May.

"We've been successful in helping the parents who attended the classes. By the third level, they are able to communicate and talk with their child's teacher," said Mr. Widger.

Students' performances are judged by political science professors, civics instructors and attorneys.

"The fun thing about the competition is that the class competes as a whole," said Mr. Josh Bill. "The students know that they are only as strong as their weakest classmate, and it creates a unique classroom dynamic where everyone is pulling for each other."

PBIS BASKETBALL GAME AT WEBSTER



The Illinois Department of Transportation is asking elementary students in kindergarten through sixth grade to help promote work zone safety through art. IDOT, the Illinois State Board of Education, the American Traffic Safety Services Foundation and the Illinois Chapter of the American Traffic Safety Services Association are sponsoring the seventh annual Illinois Work Zone Safety Calendar Contest.

This year's theme is "See Orange. Slow Down. Save Lives." There are three categories for the competition divided by grades: K-1, 2-4 and 5-6 grades. Each school must select the top four posters from each category (12 posters total) and submit them to IDOT by Nov. 30. Children are eligible to participate in the contest even if their school chooses not to participate. The child's parent or guardian can submit the drawings to IDOT.

The top 30 entries, 10 from each category, will move on to a judging panel who will determine the 12 finalists to be displayed in the 2013 Illinois Work Zone Safety Calendar. The top two finalists in each category will move on to compete in a national calendar contest.
